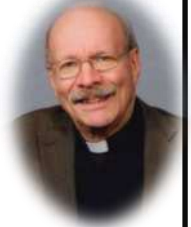

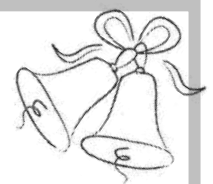

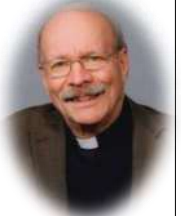

Bendito sea el Dios y Padre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que por su gran misericordia nos ha hecho nacer de nuevo a una esperanza viva, mediante la resurrección de Jesucristo de entre los muertos, y a una herencia incorruptible, inmaculada e inmarcesible, reservada en el cielo para ustedes, que están protegidos por el poder de Dios mediante la fe, para una salvación preparada para ser revelada en el último tiempo. En esto se alegran, aunque ahora, por un poco de tiempo, tengan que sufrir diversas pruebas, para que la autenticidad de su fe, más preciosa que el oro, que aunque perecedero se prueba con fuego, sea hallada en alabanza, gloria y honor cuando Jesucristo se manifieste. Aunque no lo han visto, lo aman; y aunque ahora no lo ven, creen en él y se regocijan con un gozo indescriptible y glorioso, porque están recibiendo el fruto de su fe, la salvación de sus almas. (1 Pedro 1-8)

Una parte fundamental de nuestra misión parroquial es ofrecer consuelo y sanación, de las maneras más sencillas y profundas, especialmente con nuestra oración hecha por el poder del Espíritu Santo. ¡Que nuestro mundo sea bendecido con luz, dulzura y amor divino!

Octubre mes del Rosario



Octubre es conocido como el Mes del Rosario, un tiempo dedicado especialmente a la devoción mariana a través de la oración del Santo Rosario. Esta práctica espiritual se centra en la meditación de los misterios de la vida de Jesucristo y de la Virgen María. Durante este mes, los fieles son animados a rezar el Rosario diariamente, ya sea de manera individual, en familia o en comunidad, como una forma de profundizar su fe y buscar la intercesión de María. La elección de octubre para destacar esta devoción se remonta a la conmemoración de la victoria en la Batalla de Lepanto en 1571, atribuida a la intercesión de la Virgen mediante el rezo del Rosario. Por ello, octubre se convierte en una oportunidad para fortalecer la espiritualidad y la comunidad a través de esta venerada tradición.

Reflexión

El Evangelio nos presenta dos parábolas de Jesús: la de la semilla que crece, y la del grano de mostaza. Ambas parábolas pueden ser aplicadas a la vida de la Iglesia, como a la vida del alma humana.

La vida de la Iglesia

“El Reino de Dios se parece a un hombre que echa simiente en la tierra”. ¿Quién es este sembrador?” Nada menos que Dios. El Señor ha querido compararse con un agricultor. Es Él quien arroja la semilla. ¿Y cuál es esta semilla? Es Jesucristo, nuestro Señor. Él es el grano de trigo, que vino del cielo y cayó en la tierra. Él mismo lo dijo: “Si el grano de trigo no muere queda infecundo”. Su misterio pascual, misterio de muerte y de resurrección es el misterio de un grano que muere y de un grano que resucita, que brota, y que va creciendo.

¿Y dónde va creciendo? Va creciendo en la Iglesia, fruto de la muerte de Cristo, de su sangre derramada. Si miramos la Iglesia el día en que el Señor ascendió a los cielos, nos espantamos por su pequeñez. Era el primer tallo, débil, tembloroso. La venida del Espíritu santo el día de Pentecostés hizo que ese grupo reducido tuviera el coraje de salir a la luz pública. Y allí comenzaron las conversiones.

Los apóstoles se repartieron por todo el mundo, siguiendo las rutas del Imperio Romano, por tierra y por agua. Brotaron, entonces, las pequeñas comunidades, plantadas también ellas sobre la sangre de los mártires. Y así esa Iglesia, que vimos tan pequeña en el Cenáculo, se fue extendiendo, creciendo, de día y de noche, hasta hacerse inmensa. Como dice la parábola de hoy: La tierra va produciendo la cosecha ella sola: primero los tallos, luego la espiga, después el grano.

Impresiona como el Señor escogió a un grupito de personas débiles para convertir al Imperio más grande de aquella época. Dice San Pablo que Dios eligió a los necios del mundo para confundir a los fuertes. Los apóstoles eran humildes y pequeños, pescadores y publicanos. Eran la semilla de mostaza que, cuando se la siembra, es la más pequeña, pero después crece y llega a ser la más grande de las legumbres.

La vida del alma humana

Esto que hemos considerado con respecto a la Iglesia universal, podemos también aplicarlo a cada uno de nosotros. El día en que fuimos llevados a la pila bautismal, Dios sembró la fe en nuestra alma. La fe es un don de Dios, viene de Dios, el sembrador de la vida divina. Una fe inicial, pequeña, como el grano de mostaza. Pero, a partir del día, en que adquirimos el uso de la razón, esa fe comenzó a crecer. Porque nuestra fe tiene una historia, con sus altos y sus bajos. Pero si nos mantenemos fieles, nuestra fe tiende a crecer contra viento y marea, hasta hacerse un árbol sólido donde anidan los pájaros.

La fe es, pues, como una semilla en nuestra alma, comparable a un grano de mostaza. También lo es la palabra de Dios, gracias a la cual nuestra fe va creciendo. El mismo Jesús comparó la palabra con una semilla que se anida en el corazón. Esa palabra está allí para edificar e implantar nuevas virtudes, para destruir y arrancar viejos vicios.

Si la ahogamos con nuestras preocupaciones terrenas, con nuestro egoísmo, con nuestras deslealtades, entonces esa semilla queda sofocada y perece. En el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles encontramos la hermosa expresión: “la palabra del Señor crecía”. Así debe suceder en el interior de cada uno de nosotros. ¡Dichosos los que oyen la palabra de Dios y la ponen en práctica!

Queridos hermanos, pronto nos acercaremos a recibir el Cuerpo de Jesús, de ese Jesús que se hizo semilla por nosotros, grano de trigo molido en la pasión, alimento de las almas en la Eucaristía. Pidámosle, por eso, que crezca cada día más en nuestro corazón y que nos transforme por dentro, para que así su semilla se vuelva fecunda.

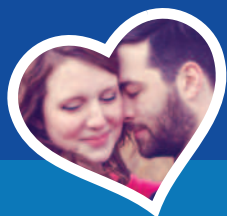

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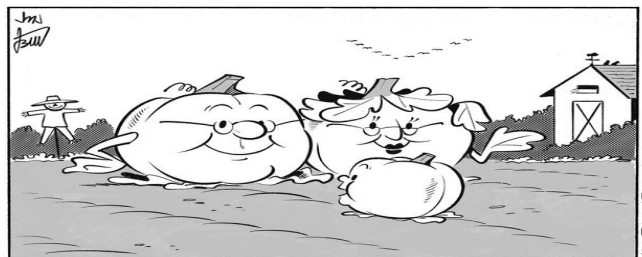
CEMETERY CLEANUP
