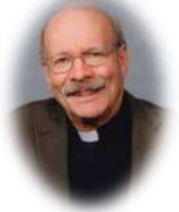
Dear Folks,

Taking up Pope Francis' desire "that all Christians come to appreciate the close connection between Christ's love and His summons to care for the poor," Pope Leo XIV issues his first Apostolic Exhortation, "*Dilexi te*," which means "I have loved you" from the Book of Revelation 3:9, as a call to Christ's disciples "to recognize him in the poor and the suffering." Pope Leo XIV's first Apostolic Exhortation signed on October 4, the Feast of St. Francis, sees the love of Christ incarnated in love for the poor, in caring for the sick, opposing slavery, defending women who experience exclusion and violence, making education available to all, accompanying migrants, charitable giving, working for equality and more. His words flow directly from the Gospel: from the Son of God's birth, life, passion, death and resurrection and gives new energy to the Catholic Social Teaching of the Church concerning the poor.

In the weeks ahead, please look for this document, which will be included as an insert in our bulletin. Many have asked if I would include more spiritual, theological or biblical documents/insights, in order to connect us with the universal Church and our local Church, the Green Bay Diocese.

Next week is the Feast of Christ the King, with Advent not far behind. We will have the opportunity to share the Blood of Christ at our Liturgies. As our Liturgical Year comes to a close, let us remember our goal: to grow in holiness, which is the fulfillment of God's Love in our hearts and lives!

Haciéndose eco del deseo del Papa Francisco de que «todos los cristianos lleguen a apreciar la estrecha conexión entre el amor de Cristo y su llamado a cuidar de los pobres», el Papa León XIV publica su primera Exhortación Apostólica, «Dilexi te», que significa «Yo te he amado», del Apocalipsis 3:9, como una invitación a los discípulos de Cristo a «reconocerlo en los pobres y los que sufren». La primera Exhortación Apostólica del Papa León XIV, firmada el 4 de octubre, fiesta de San Francisco, ve el amor de Cristo encarnado en el amor a los pobres, en el cuidado de los enfermos, la oposición a la esclavitud, la defensa de las mujeres que sufren exclusión y violencia, la garantía de una educación universal, el acompañamiento a los migrantes, la caridad, la lucha por la igualdad y mucho más. Sus palabras fluyen directamente del Evangelio: del nacimiento, la vida, la pasión, la muerte y la resurrección del Hijo de Dios, e infunden nueva energía a la Doctrina Social de la Iglesia en relación con los pobres. En las próximas semanas, estén atentos a este documento, que se incluirá como suplemento en nuestro boletín. Muchos me han preguntado si incluiría más documentos o reflexiones espirituales,



teológicas o bíblicas para conectarnos con la Iglesia universal y nuestra Iglesia local, la Diócesis de Green Bay.

La próxima semana celebraremos la Fiesta de Cristo Rey, y el Adviento está muy cerca. Tendremos la oportunidad de compartir la Sangre de Cristo en nuestras liturgias. Al concluir nuestro Año Litúrgico, recordemos nuestra meta: crecer en santidad, que es la plenitud del Amor de Dios en nuestros corazones y vidas.

Falsas seguridades

Estamos en el penúltimo domingo del tiempo ordinario; y el evangelio nos prepara para la conclusión de este ciclo litúrgico, ubicándonos en la llegada de Jesús a Jerusalén, como escuchamos el domingo anterior. De modo que, Jesús clarifica el significado de su presencia, y la seriedad de nuestra existencia cristiana.



La batalla de la crisis: pensar en ti o en los demás

El evangelista Lucas utiliza un lenguaje apocalíptico, es decir, que “revela algo” sobre algún acontecimiento último. En este caso nos encontramos con la profecía sobre la destrucción del templo de Jerusalén y la persecución de las primeras comunidades cristianas. ¿Cuáles son las posibilidades de respuesta? Evadir y huir de la crisis o afrontarla en la perspectiva de la fe. En este sentido, es bastante interesante la pregunta de los discípulos: “Maestro, ¿cuándo va a ocurrir esto y cuál será la señal de que ya está a punto de suceder?”. No es tanto una pregunta que entre en la simple curiosidad, al contrario, tal pareciera que ellos comienzan a calcular para salvaguardar sus propios intereses. En tiempos de crisis, generalmente las personas se olvidan del bien común; como escribe el novelista francés George Bernanos: “Un vientre miserable tiene más necesidad de ilusiones que de pan”.

Ante la crisis permanece firme en el amor

Este cuadro de supervivencia de los discípulos contrasta con aquella viuda que da todo de sí en aquellas dos moneditas, y que constituye la prefiguración de lo que Cristo hará en la Cruz. En la crisis no es fácil mantener un equilibrio, pues todas las falsas seguridades comienzan a tambalearse. De ahí que, Jesús invite a “permanecer firmes”; de hecho, este verbo en griego (ὑπομονή – hypomone) significa literalmente “permanecer bajo”, en otras palabras, es la evocación a sostener y soportar. Podríamos decir que no es liberarse del peso de la crisis, sino saberlo llevar o cargar. Así, permanecer firmes, nos ayuda a entender que es mucho más importante la fidelidad a Dios que la lealtad a los hombres, al igual que la existencia cristiana consiste en perseverar en la esperanza de Dios, erradicando el vientre miserable de las ilusiones de grandeza, que lleva al olvido del Evangelio y del bien común.

Cuando Lucas escribe este texto, muy probablemente, la comunidad ya se encuentra en la crisis de la persecución; de modo que las palabras de Jesús constituyen una luz de esperanza para ese momento presente, y que lo sigue siendo, para cada tiempo de la historia.

Las crisis como las personas pasan, y siempre una crisis se convierte en Dios, en una gran oportunidad, haciendo experiencia de su consuelo. Permanezcamos en la firmeza de la fe, sabiendo que aquí radica la verdadera pobreza, aquella en la que dejas tus falsas seguridades para anclar tu vida en la Vida de Dios.



What is a hearing loop and how does it work?

Hearing loops allow people who wear hearing aids to directly receive the sound from the church's PA system in their own hearing aids without having to pick up a separate listening device.

Do you use hearing aids?

If you wear hearing instruments you will need to find out if your hearing aids have this wireless receiver called a T-coil or Telecoil built in, in order to benefit from the hearing loop in our church. The T-coil program is accessed by pushing a button on a hearing aid. This T-coil program has to be activated by your audiologist. Talk to your audiologist to find out if your instruments can have both a T (no background noise pick up) and an MT program (blended micro-phone & T-coil program) for improved hearing at church.

Hearing loops improve hearing aids!

Digital hearing aids have significantly improved in the last decade, but they do not restore hearing to normal. Difficulties often remain when in challenging listening situations. Hearing loops help hearing aid users overcome this problem by broadcasting sound without background noise or reverberation.

For questions about your hearing aids and telecoils talk to your audiologist.
