

Worship Community

Involvement:

Plans and prepares for the seasons of the Church year and special liturgies. Those who serve have a special love for the liturgy of the Church and a desire to help people grow spiritually in love of God and neighbor. Also looks after the art and environment of the Worship Space and coordinates the various liturgical ministries.

Commitment: Monthly meetings are held.

Liturgy Ministry You are trained in all areas.

- Sacristans: Assist in setting up the Worship Space for liturgy: setting out
 vessels, preparing gifts for procession, ensuring the arrival of Proclaimers, Greeters, Eucharistic Ministers, Servers and inviting volunteers to carry the Processional Cross and clothe the Sacred Table. Vessels are then cleansed after Worship and put away.
- Servers: This ministry is open to all boys and girls who are in grades four and above. Parents with a child can serve together.
- Cross Bearer: This can be an adult or youth. When Mass starts you will take the cross up to the front of church as part of the procession. When Mass ends, you take the cross out of church as part of the ending procession.
- **Funeral Altar Servers:** This Ministry assists the priest at funeral services. These ministers help to represent the entire parish at a time when a family is in need of Christian compassion and hope.
- Proclaimers of the Word: Serve the community in a deeply reflective way
 by imparting the spirit of the Word of God. Anyone willing to share their ability
 to proclaim as well as their faith in this way is encouraged to do so. This ministry is open to anyone high school and older.
- Eucharistic Ministers: Where one truly shares the Body and Blood of Jesus as well as oneself during the communion procession. Assist in distributing Communion hosts or the consecrated wine.
- Hospitality/Usher: Warm and friendly smiles, welcoming handshakes help set an inclusive tone for the liturgy. These Ministers welcome everyone as they enter the Worship Space and hand them a liturgical aid. If not previously assigned, ask some one to clothe the altar and bring up the gifts. Help with seating if necessary. Take up the collection. Will also assist with the "Reverse Collection" when needed. After Mass collect the liturgical aids and straighten up the Worship Space. Put the collection into a bank bag and give it to the sacristan for deposit. Must go through a training session. You will be assigned to the weekend Masses that you have requested. Assigned schedule comes out every few months. Need to arrive early and leave a little later than the rest. Truly the watchful order of the Church: offering assistance, handing out liturgical aids, and keeping an eye on the needs of all, even using an umbrella on a rainy day to escort people from their cars!
- Funeral Hospitality: Open doors and greet family members and friends
 of the deceased with compassion and love. This may happen during the day,
 evening or weekend. Answer questions they may have.

Worship: Music Liturgy

Choirs: Adult and Children

Involvement: Willingness and love for singing and the desire to enhance the Assembly's worship. All voices are welcome to sing with us. For the Funeral choir, you should be available during the day, evenings or weekends to sing during funeral liturgies, ministering to families through music.

Instrumentalist: Piano, Organ, Flute. Horn, etc..

Commitment: Weekend liturgies and/or special feast and celebrations.

Rehearsal is on Monday night starting at 6:30 pm.

For funerals, a brief rehearsal 1/2 hour before the funeral liturgy.

Cantors: Provide leadership and direction during Mass. They encourage the congregation to participate in song and to pray through the gift of music.

FAITH FORMATION

Baptism Preparation

Involvement: Meet with couples who are preparing for the baptism of their child. Discussing with them the Sacrament and it's Symbols and Ritual in a relaxed and meaningful way as a person(s) who has walked this parenting journey. Training will be provided.

Commitment: Based on the number of volunteers. Baptism preps typically offered monthly. Time will vary from 1-1 1/2 hours.

Catechesis for all

Involvement: Will be working with Religious Education students—teachers may be needed for the various grades; Children's Liturgy, Vacation Bible School, or various planned events.

Commitment: Children's Liturgy—Sundays during 10:00 Mass. Plan activity for ages 3-7 for about 20 minutes. Sign up on a rotating basis. You will need to take the VIRTUS Program when working with children. Vacation Bible School—held during one of the summer months for one week. Helpers are needed to teach, food preparation, assistants, or set up/clean up. Time commitment will vary.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

Involvement: Faith sharing and sharing of Scripture with Catechumens/Candidates.

**Faith Responders: This group is comprised of parish members/families of St. Thomas who are interested in reaching out to help our parish members when help is needed for Spring and Fall lawn clean-ups (helping our elderly with lawn cutting), cooking meals, housekeeping, moving, minor house repairs and painting, landscaping help at St. Thomas and emergency clean ups. Our outreach to our local community consists of working with Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, Salvation Army, and any other group that may need our assistance. At this time St. Thomas has about 50 parish members that are part of this group.

Involvement: When help is needed for a project you will be informed through an email. Sometimes help is needed within a few days.

Each situation is different Springtime is a busier time with lawn clean ups and setting up schedules for lawn cutting.

SUPPORT MINISTRIES

- **Baking: Throughout the year, desserts, cookies, bars are needed for the Holiday Bazaar, Christian Women dessert table at the parish picnic, for dinners or events at St. Thomas. Your name will be put on a list to be called when these items are needed.
- **Building Cleaners: The building is thoroughly cleaned the first Monday of the month-windows are cleaned, (when it lands on a Holiday, it will be cleaned the following day or following Monday). On the remaining Mondays, general cleaning is done—bathrooms cleaned, church cleaned, vacuuming rugs, etc... You can either sign up to help with weekly cleaning or the monthly building cleaning.

One group comes the first, third and if needed the fifth Thursdays of the month and the other group comes the second and fourth Thursdays of the month. You will help put inserts in the bulletins, tape them shut and put family address labels on the bulletins. Takes about 1 to 1½ hours, depending on how many inserts there are.
